Date

This 25 hectare nature reserve is a wonderful wetland: flower-rich marshland criss-crossed with dykes which are home to many species of dragonflies and damselflies, including the rare Norfolk hawker. With luck you may even spot a water vole. Cattle graze some areas of the marsh. Fen and scrub habitats support many bird species including reed buntings and Cetti's warblers. The large open water, known as St Andrew's Broad, was created in recent years by gravel extraction. Here many kinds of waterbirds can be seen. Look for cormorants, great crested grebes, gadwalls and tufted ducks.

NWT Thorpe Marshes is a vital link in a chain of important wildlife sites alongside the River Yare.

Important for people and wildlife: this nature reserve enables wildlife to thrive close to the busy City of Norwich and people to enjoy its peace and natural beauty.

NWT Thorpe Marshes is just a short cycle or bus ride


from the bustle of Norwich city centre. Please note there is

Dogs: Please keep dogs under close control to avoid disturbance to stock and wildlife.

Directions: In Thorpe St Andrew turn off Yarmouth Road by traffic lights taking Whitlingham Lane (this is opposite Thunder Lane, NR7 OQA). At the end of this road you will find the footbridge over the railway line giving access to the nature reserve.
