NWT Thorpe Marshes November flowers, 2017

On Thorpe Marshes guided walks in five successive Novembers (9 November 2013, 10 November 2014, 4 November 2015, 11 November 2016 and 14 November 2017) we made a note of all the flowers we found in flower. Totals were 30, 32, 30, 23 and 33 species. There was a lot of variation in species found between years, with a total of 54 species across the five years. Below is the list for 14 November 2017.

We didn't include leaves, seedheads etc – all had petals, or at least flowers for plants without obvious ray petals, such as pineapple mayweed.

There is a bias towards plants of disturbed ground rather than marshland species. It is grouped in botanical families where more than one of a family was found – especially composites *Asteraceae*, the daisy family.
